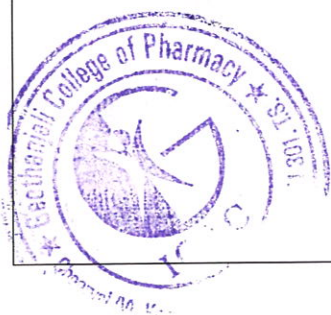

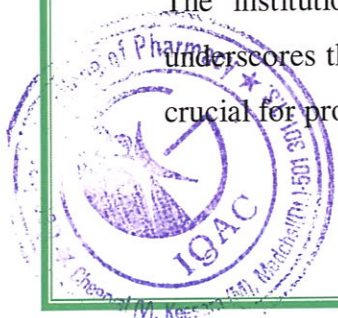

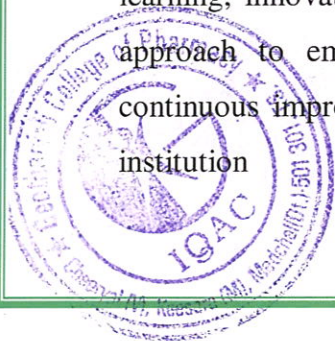

The various ICT tools are used for effective Teaching-Learning process:

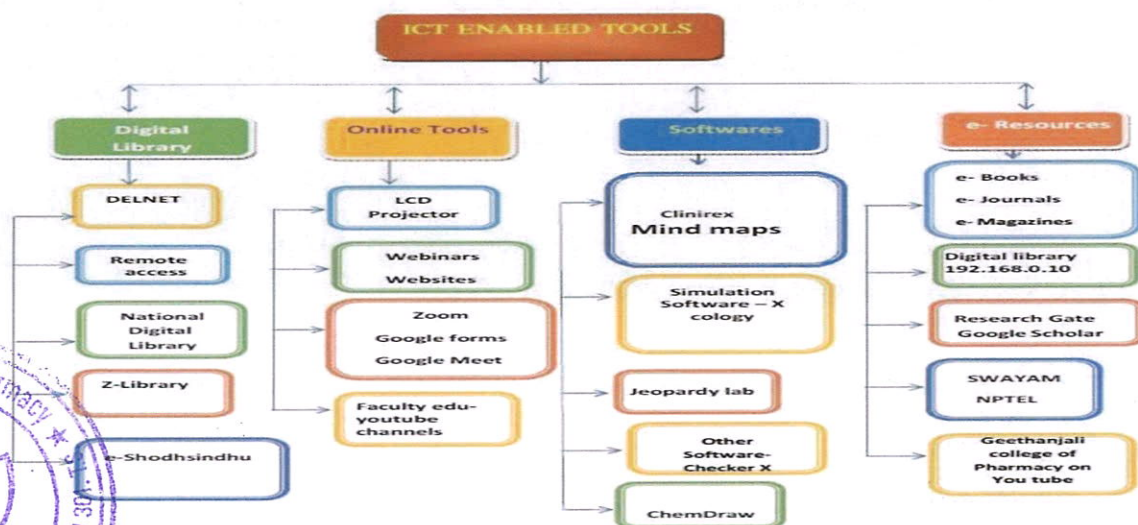
1. The PPTS are used with animations and simulations to improve the quality of teaching-learning process.

- G) Workshops-** Teachers use various ICT tools for conducting workshops

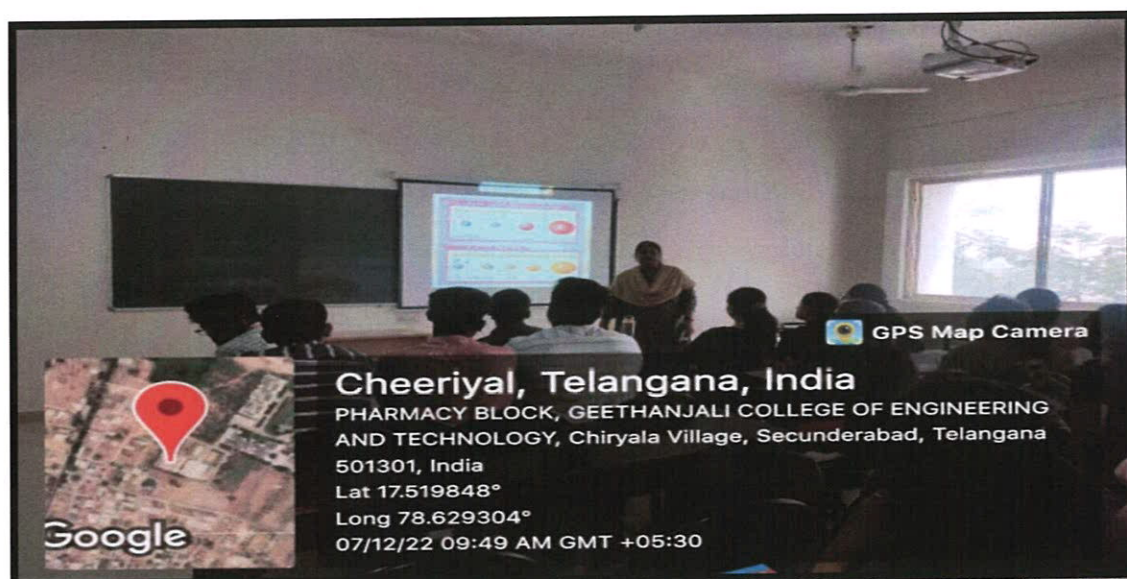

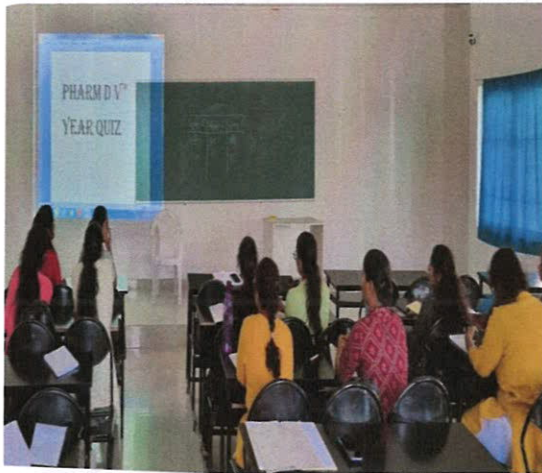
POWER POINT

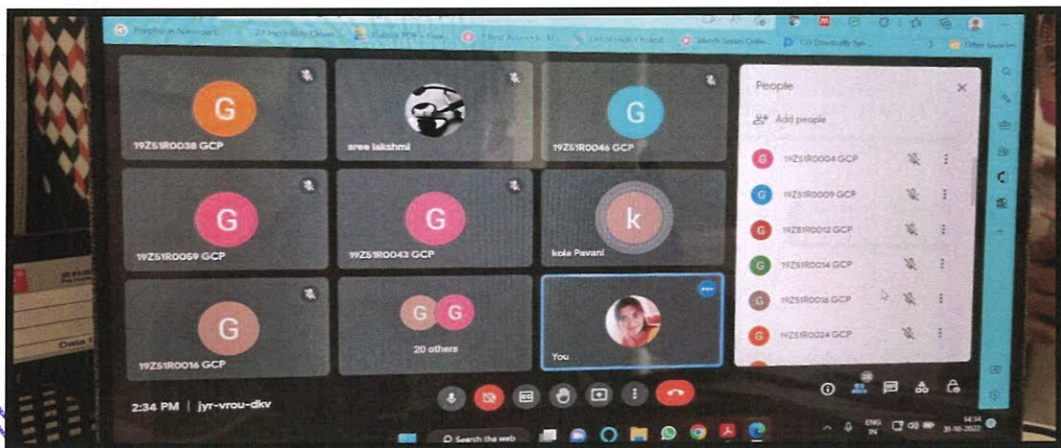

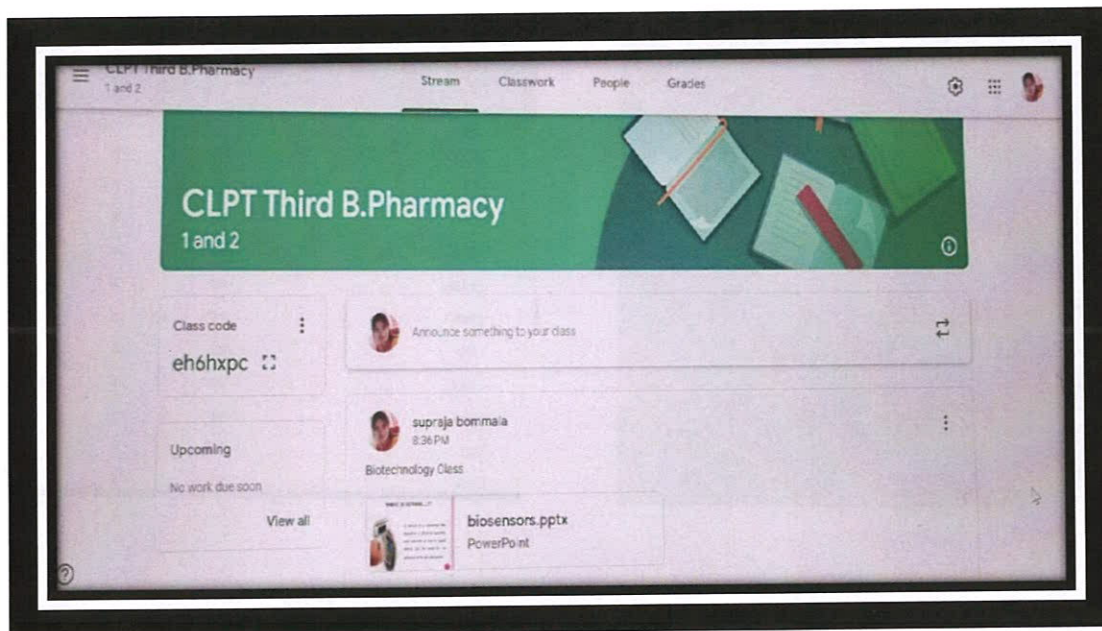
GOOGLE MEET

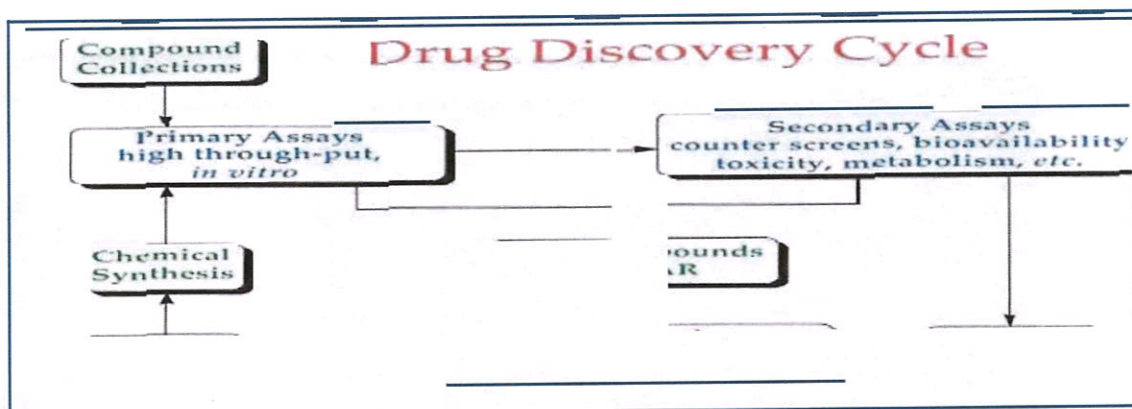

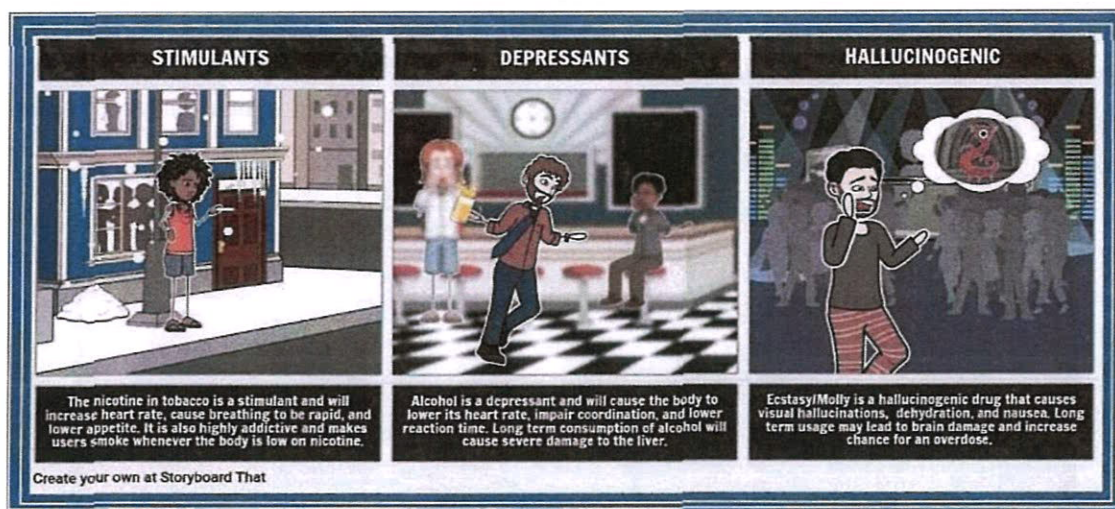


Medicinal Chemistry Optimization Flow chart



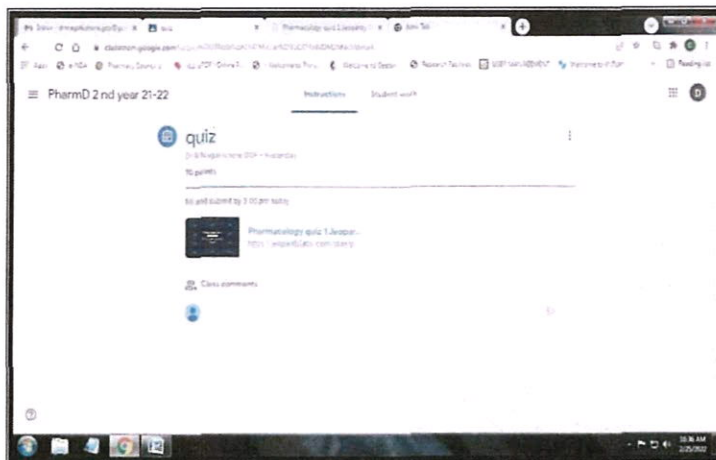
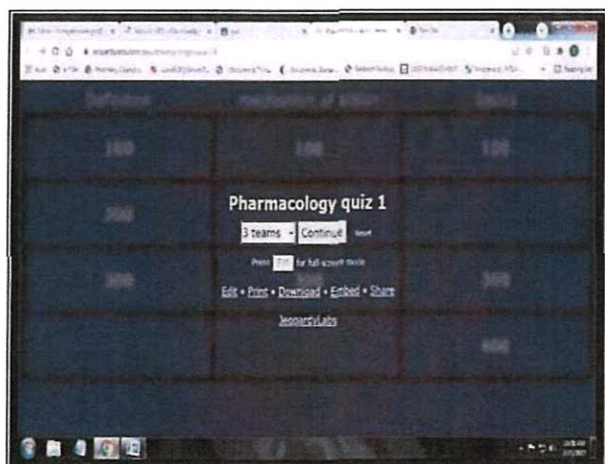
STORY BOARD

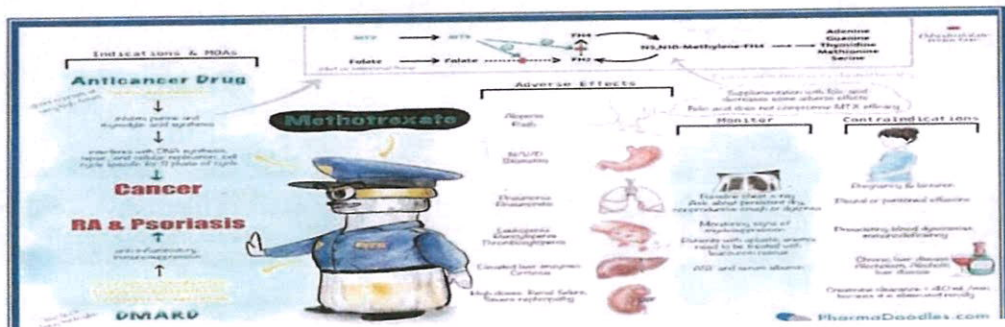

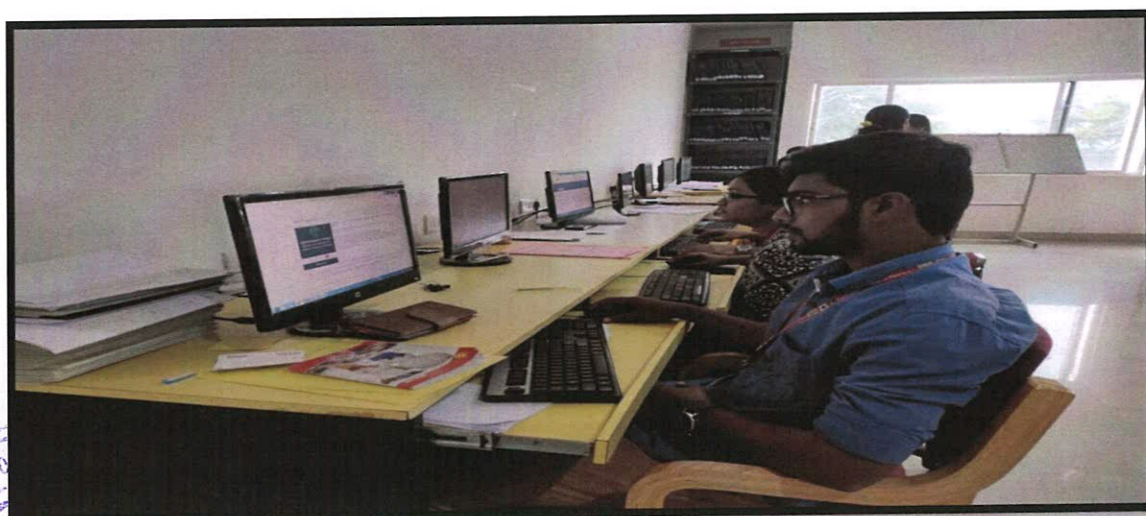
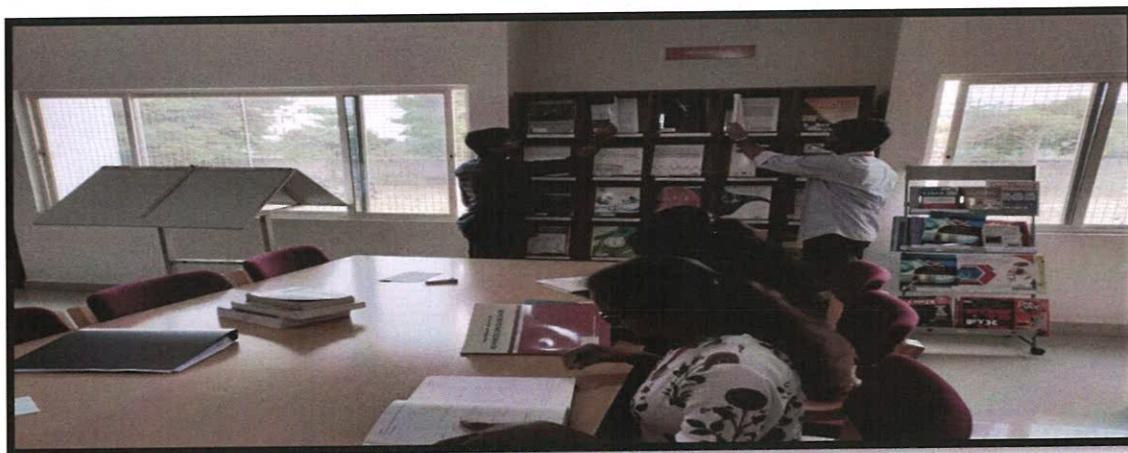
DIGITAL LIBRARY
